## Our First Property Auction for Unpaid Taxes

A recent look at unpaid taxes shows that almost 40 property owners have not paid their taxes for more than 2 years. In years past, after a warning letter was sent out, the overdue accounts were turned over to the Provincial Government who would do the nasty work of tax collection by tax sale. This process kept our taxes relatively current. Unfortunately, the Provincial government no longer provides this service to smaller taxation bodies like the WLLID and without this enforcement vehicle, delinquencies have grown significantly. We now have no choice but to conduct our own tax sale if we wish to collect our revenue.

At its last meeting, the board decided to initiate an annual tax recovery auction later this year on properties with taxes unpaid for more than two years. However as the auction date is specified by law as the last Monday on September, a date which may be a little tight to organize a first-time venture, the board may extend its decision and hold the first tax sale on the last Monday of September 2014. This probable delay to 2014 will give us plenty of opportunity to encourage folks to bring their taxes up to date before the hammer falls.

The following link is to the appropriate legislation on tax sales. There is a statutory requirement for newspaper advertising, but it's interesting to note that there is no requirement to give notice of sale directly to the property owner until after their property has been sold.





## WHAT COVERS YOUR CONSCIOUSNESS

## HISTORY BYTES

## BLAYLOCK AND COMINCO

Blaylock is a name recognized by Trail and west Kootenay people. Selwyn G. Blaylock was born in 1879 in Paspebiac, Quebec, attended Bishops College School, then McGill University. He graduated with a BSc in 1899 and came west first as a surveyor for Trail Canadian Smelter Co. Two years later he became the chief chemist for the smelter. Shortly thereafter he was sent to Nelson to be Superintendant of the Hall Mines Smelter. (Hall Mines Smelter was attempting to outdo the Pilot Point Smelter). After organizing the Nelson smelter he was transferred to Moyie where he supervised the final active years of the St. Eugene Mine. Next the Sullivan Mine in Kimberley attracted his attention. Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company was formed in 1906. Blaylock advocated that CM&S purchase the Sullivan, which they did in 1908 and appointed him responsible for its development.

While working as a chemist he experimented with crushed ore which collected on bubbles while slag settled out of the foaming mix. His team refined the process with variations and the Flotation Process revolutionized the percentage of mineral recovered from complex ores from Kootenay mines. Blaylock was repeatedly honoured for this discovery.

In 1919 he became Cominco General Manager then Director in 1922. By 1927 his title was Vice President, and in 1939 he became President. He negotiated new deals and international contracts, and complained that there was no suitable hotel or conference facility in the Kootenays... so decided to build a mansion to entertain important business quests. He purchased 42 acres at Robert's Bay on the north shore above Nelson, hired an architect to design a Tudor style mansion, started building during the Depression and soon had the servants wing completed. Many of his builders were young engineers who had to be laid off from the smelter. The beautiful home was complemented by magnificent gardens and an arboretum. His head gardener was Mike Roberts who had lived all his life next door. The Blaylock Mansion hosted VIPs from around the world. Whether the visit there was about business or entertaining old friends, Mr. Blaylock and his wife Margo made all feel welcome.

Trail Smelter gave off emissions which inhibited plant growth for miles around. When US companies threatened action against CM&S. researchers soon found how to extract.... and use the sulphur which had been poisoning the area. Elephant Brand fertilizer quickly became a major seller more than paying for the revisions to the once dirty system.

During WWII there was a hush-hush addition to the smelter. Trail was chosen as a site to manufacture Heavy Water for the Nuclear Industry. The operation of this plant was out of bounds for staff in the rest of the complex. One summer student who asked questions about it was cross examined while security police glowered behind and beside him. Finally the interrogator sent the student back to his assignment on the far side of the complex with strict orders to never discuss this operation again.

Mr Blaylock was a benevolent dictator. His stated belief was that "security, comfort and welfare of workmen will be paid for in increased efficiency and goodwill of employees." He even attended Union meetings and reworded motions to suit his intentions....like improving safety in the work place. This "Great White Father" had regular family benefit days and a turkey for every home at Christmas. He was always a fan of the Smoke Eaters hockey team and made sure they were supported even to International level. (The Smoke Eaters twice won the world amateur championship.)

But a selfish move during his gathering of trees for his arboretum introduced LITTLE CHERRY disease to the once proud cherry crops of the West Kootenay.

Against advice of customs officers and BC Agriculturists he insisted on bringing home infected Japanese Flowering Cherry trees. He boasted about the great variety of specimens planted behind his Mansion. For example, when the dogwood was chosen as British Columbia's

flower, Kootenay residents complained that was a "strictly coastal tree" we were told that a pair now blossom at the "Willow Point" estate of Mr. Blaylock. Actually Selwyn Blaylock hardly had time to soak in the wonderful surrounds as he died barely six months after retiring in 1945. Mrs. Blaylock spent short periods there and sold the property in 1977 to a couple who ran it as a bed and breakfast. Now it is a sought after spa and resort where weddings and like special events occur. The Blaylock Mansion will remind observers about a man who was given the power to implement many great things and a single very negative one for the Kootenays.
